H. HIGHWAY: Busy weekend with the storm. Superintendent Walter distributed the following letter for the board review:

January 6, 2024

To the Town of Springport Supervisor and Trustees:

I recently reviewed Springport's 2024 proposed budget for departments and salaries for Town employees. I was dismayed to discover that most employees are receiving significant raises for the 2024 fiscal year, however, the Highway Superintendent was not.

In November, I was informed that I may not be receiving a wage increase because of funding needed for the Townline Road bridge replacement, and for my criticism of the Trustee's use, or lack of use, of taxpayer's money towards equipment replacement, etc. What other employees are sacrificing wages to pay for a bridge?

I have been employed by the Town of Springort for 21 years with highway and

water/sewer responsibilities. I've been Highway Superintendent for the last two years and was re-elected for '24-'25. I believe it would be irresponsible for me not to communicate concerns about the condition of essential equipment in the Highway department projecting any potential budget considerations that may need to be addressed to the governing board. The water/sewer administrator, who has been employed for 10 years, was trained by me and still continues to learn from me. The two of us work very well together serving the Town of Springport. He is budgeted to earn over \$3,000 more than me. I find this very unfair. Therefore, I am asking for the Town Trustees to amend the 2024 budget to adjust my salary to compensate for my responsibilities for not only Highway Superintendent, but also for the daily duties that I perform for the water/sewer department. My salary increase in all fairness should compare to percentage raises already granted to all other staff in the budget. As an elected official, I will be held accountable to the taxpayers come November in election years. Sincerely, William Walter, Highway Superintendent, Resident and Taxpayer
